One Way Farm Children's Home is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization; the mission of One Way Farm Children's Home is to stop the cycle of child abuse and provide a loving environment for children to grow in mind, spirit and body. One Way Farm Children's Home has developed programs to further the potential of all children without regard to race, color, creed, or national origin.

Dear Friends:

- A. The One Way Farm serves as a home for abandoned and abused children and has served approximately 8,000 children to date.
- B. Providing counseling for children and families for reunification.
- C. Providing medical and dental care for children in crisis.
- D. Provide housing, education, psychological and medication evaluations.

UPDATE

1. For the year 2006 One Way Farm has worked with many children with the help of our local community, corporations, foundations and concerned individuals. In 2006, the bathrooms in the shelters have been remodeled at a cost of \$18,000. The driveways have all been sealed in addition to a driveway to our Animal Therapy Barn. A large Gazebo was donated to the girl's shelter. New roofs were put on the shelters and the multi purpose building in 2006. The multi purpose building had an addition added at a cost of \$165,000.00 for administrative offices, counseling and arts and crafts. The animals now have kennels to be able to enjoy the outdoors.
2. The ages of the children who come to us now have dropped considerably; the average age is 9-13 years, down from 6-18. Percentages also reflect issues we see regularly: 25% are MRDD, 50% are dysfunctional and 25% have multiple disabilities directly related to their abusive pasts. Of the total population, 99% have histories of sexual abuse.
3. Our psychiatric services to the children, along with counseling, have become an effective avenue toward productivity.
4. The animal therapy barn has untold benefits.

ASSETS

- a. One Way Farm is situated on 11.5 acres, valued at \$400,000.

- b. New Dawn and Eagles Nest Shelters housing children are valued at \$200,000. each, including furnishings.
- c. Administrative Building, Chapel and *All Purpose Room are valued at \$680,000.00, including furnishings.
- d. Five vehicles used for transportation to schools, doctor appointments, shopping and recreation are valued at \$80,000.
- e. A 20 X 80 heated and air conditioned barn, including 12 partitioned rooms, is used for Animal Education and Maintenance valued at \$110,000.
- f. Picnic Shelter valued at \$20,000.
- g. 30X60 barn for activities and storage valued at \$70,000
- h. Have 30 staff providing 24/7 care of children

*Of the above the only building with any debt is the multi-purpose building.
